About the Awards

rthur D. Allen was a medical doctor; a surgeon who practiced in Bay City for nearly 50 years. He was born in 1894 and died in 1977. The work he began early in the last century continues today through his legacy to the community.

Dr. Allen began his medical practice in Auburn as a general practitioner. After six years, he decided to enter the field of surgery. He returned to school for additional training, an unusual commitment during a time when specialties such as surgery were learned through apprenticeship.

In 1920, Dr. Allen married Ruth McIntire. They had two children; a son, William, who died at age 12 of a congenital heart condition, and their daughter, Nancy.

Dr. Allen used a horse and sleigh during the winter to make house calls. He had several horses stabled around his practice territory so he could get to patients in an emergency. It was said of Dr. Allen that he always put his patients first, even before his family.

An inventor, he developed an alcohol mixture to use in car radiators before the days of antifreeze. Dr. Allen developed a motor that could be immersed in water, and a special fracture frame that was later patented by the salesman who distributed the device. He was one of the first to use hydrotherapy for his patients.

n 1938, Dr. Allen led a group of physicians who built the Allen Medical building on Bay City's West Side. It was described as having a "monumental atmosphere." The facility attracted the attention of many architects and medical professionals from across the nation. The Allen Medical Building was built at a cost of \$50,000–at the time a tremendous sum–yet Dr. Allen paid off the loan in just 10 years.

During World War II, when most physicians in town were drafted, Dr. Allen worked 15 hours a day, 7 days a week providing medical care to a desperately underserved community.

At his death in 1977, Dr. Allen provided another legacy to McLaren Bay Region in the form of a trust fund. Annual distributions from the fund are used exclusively for McLaren Bay Region equipment purchases.

Arthur D. Allen, M.D. was a man of vision and enterprise. He touched many lives during his 50 years as a physician, and through his vision he continues to contribute to the profession he loved.

The Arthur D. Allen M.D. Service Award was created to honor other physicians who have provided distinguished service to the medical staff and community.
