

Change in Physician Office Visit Co-Pay for Patients Notice of Beneficiary Co-Insurance

To Our Valued Patients:

As of April 1, 2012, this physician office started operating as a hospital-based facility, and is considered to be part of McLaren-Macomb Medical Center. The details below may be familiar to some of our patients, since many other physician offices and hospital systems in Southeast Michigan currently use the hospital-based model.

What does this mean to our patients? You may notice changes in your physician office co-pay (also known as coinsurance liability).

Because the care you are receiving is being provided by a department of the hospital, you may experience co-pays that refer to two separate charges: the "office facility fee" and the "professional fee". Physician offices that are not hospital-based do not have office facility fees, so these charges do not impact the patient's co-pay. The amount of these co-pays depends on the care provided and is determined by your insurance company.

If you are enrolled in a second insurance coverage plan or in a state medical assistance program such Medicaid, your co-pay may be covered in full.

How will patient bills be different for patients? You may receive two billing statements, one from this physician office and one from the hospital.

- The physician billing statement is for services provided by the physician, physician assistant, resident or nurse practitioner.
- Your hospital billing statement is for the office facility room charge, x-rays, procedures, supplies and laboratory work.
