

From diagnosis to cure, our team of specialists are on hand to deliver exceptional clinical care and support you through your journey with breast cancer.

Our Comprehensive Breast Program is a coordinated system of care through the McLaren Imaging Center, the Karmanos Cancer Institute at McLaren Flint, and helpful support services offered through McLaren. The Comprehensive Breast Program brings together all medical specialties and support services to care for the clinical, physical, emotional, and financial needs of individuals with breast disease.

In fall of 2018 McLaren Flint elevated its commitment to breast cancer patients, and the quality of care they receive, with the addition of a Breast Oncology Surgery Fellowship. Research shows having this highly trained, specialized physician in place improves patient outcomes. McLaren Flint has the only cancer program in the region with this fellowship specialty.

Whether it is a women's first stop for consultation following a diagnosis or a second opinion, a team of physician specialists will collectively evaluate each case and recommend a best course of treatment. This evaluation is provided free of charge and without obligation.




# COMPLEMENTARY AND SUPPORT SERVICES

## THOSE AT HIGH-RISK FOR BREAST CANCER

Most experts agree that genetic testing of individuals who do not have cancer should be performed only when the person's individual or family history suggests the possible presence of a harmful mutation. Our oncology specialists can help determine the risk for mutation in different genes including BRCA1, BRCA2, PALPB2, PTEN, etc., and refer patients for genetic counseling as needed.



## IMAGING AND DIAGNOSTIC SERVICES

Mammography is often the first detector of early stage breast cancer. McLaren Imaging Center uses digital mammography to produce high resolution images including the Genius™ 3D Mammogram. With this technology, physicians have greater diagnostic accuracy, reducing the likelihood of false positive results while increasing the ability to detect at an earlier, more treatable stage. The Genius 3D exam is the mammogram FDA approved as superior for women with dense breasts.

If further testing is requested, the McLaren Imaging Center staff will help coordinate any additional diagnostic tests, which may include a breast MRI, an ultrasound, or an MRI-guided breast biopsy.

### **CANCER CARE**

Breast surgeon Ashley Richardson, DO, leads a weekly multidisciplinary clinic. Physician specialists representing all modes of treatment meet in person to discuss new breast cancer cases and the best course of clinical care based on each patient's individual situation. The surgeon then meets with the patient to discuss the team's recommendation.

### TREATMENT OPTIONS

Clinical treatment for breast cancer may consist of surgery, radiation, chemotherapy, endocrine therapy or a combination of these options.

Our patients have convenient access to advanced therapies through our skilled surgeons, precise radiation technology, modern medicines, and Phase II and Phase III clinical trials. Qualifying candidates also have the ability to be referred to participate in Phase I clinical trials through the Karmanos Cancer Institute in Detroit.
