

When to refer to the McLaren Macomb out patient seizure/epilepsy clinic

Any patient with a new diagnosis of seizures/epilepsy should be referred to the epilepsy clinic.

Any patient with an existing diagnosis of seizures/epilepsy and/or on anti-seizure medication should be offered a follow up in the epilepsy clinic, if they do not have /have not seen a seizure specialist.

Clinical Basis:

- A. Co-morbid conditions seen in seizure/epilepsy patients
 i)50% of patients with a brain tumor develop seizures
 ii)20 to 33% of patients with a stroke, or brain bleed develop seizures
 iii)50% of patient with a head injury and develop seizures
- B. Delay in Diagnosis and Treatment can lead to consequences such as but not limited to falls, sprains, strains, fractures, head injury, or even sudden death.
 i)On average it takes 12 years for a patients with epilepsy to be diagnosed and treated optimally, consequently referral can to a seizure specialist/ epileptologist improves outcomes, and quality of life.
