PATIENT RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES

McLaren Greater Lansing (MGL) and its medical staff adhere to certain responsibilities, quality health care in a spirit of personal dignity, safety and respect. It is our goal to ensure that your rights and responsibilities have been described.

MGL recognizes the right of the patient to receive the right care, including the right to treatment in the hospital without coercion, discrimination, or retaliation. A patient has the right to have a complaint received, handled, investigated, or legally addressed in a timely manner. Patient rights are not subject to suspension or termination for non-compliance with hospital rules, regulations, or policies.

The Right to Access Care

- A patient will receive treatment in the best of his or her care, including, but not limited to, emergency, urgent, and non-urgent care.
