<p><b>A controlled substance is a drug or other substance that the United States Drug Enforcement Administration has identified as having a potential for abuse. My provider shared the following:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. The risks of substance use disorder and overdose associated with the controlled substance containing an opioid.</li> <li>b. Individuals with mental illness and substance use disorders may have an increased risk of addiction to a controlled substance.</li> <li>c. Mixing opioids with benzodiazepines, alcohol, muscle relaxers, or any other drug that may depress the central nervous system can cause serious health risks, including death or disability.</li> <li>d. For a female who is pregnant or is of reproductive age, the heightened risk of short and long-term effects of opioids, including but not limited to neonatal abstinence syndrome.</li> <li>e. Any other information necessary for patients to use the drug safely and effectively as found in the patient counseling information section of the labeling for the controlled substance.</li> <li>f. Safe disposal of opioids has shown to reduce injury and death in family members. Proper disposal of expired, unused or unwanted controlled substances may be done through community take-back programs, local pharmacies, or local law enforcement agencies. It is a felony to illegally deliver, distribute or share a controlled substance without a prescription properly issued by a licensed health care provider.</li> </ul>
