

During pregnancy, there are a series of prenatal tests or exams ordered to ensure the health of mom and baby. The following is a general timeline of what tests or exams to expect during your pregnancy. *Additional tests, not listed, may be ordered at the discretion of your provider.

Initial appointment (6-8 weeks gestation)

- Confirm pregnancy and dating
- Urinalysis and culture
- Bloodwork prenatal profile
 - CBC
 - Blood type/RH factor
 - Syphillis
 - Rubella antibody
 - Hepatitis B
 - Hepatitis C
 - HIV

OB Intake Visit (10 weeks gestation)

- Review patient and family medical history
- Review pregnancy care
- Discuss diet and nutrition
- Genetic screening if applicable

10-12 weeks gestation OB PE

- Pap/pelvic and cultures
 - Chlamydia
 - Gonorrhea
 - Trichomonas
- Breast exam
- Baby's heartbeat

15-20 weeks gestation

QUAD screen

18-20 weeks gestation

Anatomy ultrasound

26-28 weeks gestation

- Glucose tolerance test
- CBC
- RhoGAM injection (for RH negative patients)

35-36 weeks gestation

Group B strep swab

Office Visit Schedule

- Every 4 weeks up to 28 weeks
- From 28-36 weeks, you will be seen every 2 weeks
- From 36 weeks to delivery, you will be seen weekly

Every visit you can anticipate

- Weight
- Blood pressure
- Urine dip test
- Measure growth of uterus
- Baby's heartbeat
- Drug screen (per doctors discretion)
