Dr. Morkos realizes all patients are unique and that you must be sensitive to each person's pain. What might be five and severe for one person, might be a "10" for another person. Dr. Morkos creates a bond with his patients, realizing they have to trust each other for healing to occur.

"My goal for my patients is to interrupt the cycle of pain." says Dr. Morkos, "Sixty percent of our spine procedures are facet blocks, epidural injections for radiculopathy, or to calm trigger points in the cervical, lumbar and thoracic areas of the spine."

Dr. Morkos has a special interest in electronic spinal cord stimulation which can specifically target pain spots and allows the patient to manage their pain.
