- Autism spectrum disorders
- Cancer
- Cardiovascular disease
- COPD
- Depression
- Diabetes
- Hypertension or high blood pressure

WHAT IS THE COST?

Depending on insurance coverage, there may be a minimal copay or no out of pocket cost to receive chronic care management. Patients can call their insurance to determine coverage.

As a chronic care management coordinator, Margaret will be your point of contact regarding any new or worsening symptoms related to your illness. While your primary care provider (PCP) will continue to oversee your care, Margaret will check in more frequently on your health and communicate any changes to your PCP and the Chronic Care Management team.
