Aldrete Score 10= Optimum; 8- 9= Safe for Discharge
Activity:

- 2- Able to move all 4 extremities
Exception: spinal, block
- 1- Able to move 2 extremities
- 0- Unable to voluntarily move extremities

Respiratory:

- 2- Able to cough and deep breathe
- 1- Labored or limited, has airway
- 0- Apneic, requires assistance Endo Tube Cuff

Circulation:

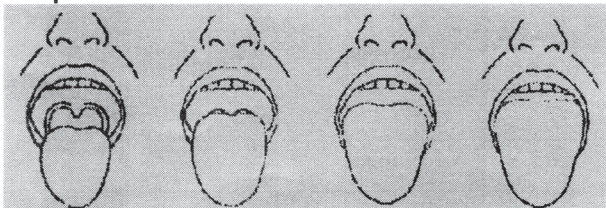
- 2- Stable BP and P., BP +/-20 norm for patient (min 90mm Hg systolic)
- 1- BP = +/- 20-50 of norm for patient
- 0- Has abnormally high or low BP = +/- 50 or more of norm for patient

State of Consciousness:

- 2- Fully alert, answers questions freely
- 1- Responds to verbal stimuli but drifts off to sleep easily
- 0- Non responding or responding to painful stimuli only

Color:

- 2- Pink mucosa or normal complexion
- 1- Pale, dusky, blotchy or jaundiced
- 0- Cyanotic

Mallampati Scale:


Class I Class II Class III Class IV

ASA Classification:

- Class I: a normal - healthy patient*
- Class II: a patient with mild systemic disease*
- Class III: a patient with severe systemic disease*
- Class IV: a patient with severe systemic disease that is a constant threat to life*
- Class V: a moribund patient who is not expected to survive without the operation*
