What is home health care?

McLaren Homecare delivers clinically excellent, compassionate health care to patients where they are most comfortable—at home. Whether you are transitioning from the hospital or sub-acute rehab facility to home, recovering from an illness, surgery or injury, McLaren Homecare helps you get better, regain your independence, and remain safe in your own home.

Home health care is a range of health care services provided at home to treat an illness or injury. Examples of skilled home care services include wound care for pressure sores or a surgical wound, intravenous or nutrition therapy, monitoring of a chronic illness or unstable health status, and rehab therapy services. Home health care is available anywhere you call home, including at an assisted living facility (ALF) or adult foster care home (AFC).

Is home health care right for me?

Home health care may be right for you after an inpatient hospital stay for management of a chronic condition such as chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), congestive heart failure (CHF), diabetes, kidney disease, or respiratory disease, among others.

Home health care may also be appropriate following a surgery, such as a joint replacement.

Home health care may be indicated if you need:

- Help recovering from an illness, accident or injury
- Treatment or monitoring of wounds
- Administration or monitoring of medications
- Education relating to a medical condition
- Continued support following recent discharge from a hospital or nursing home
- Assistance managing multiple or complex medical conditions such as diabetes, congestive heart failure (CHF), chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), or cancer diagnosis
- Special equipment and supplies to treat a medical condition

OR

- A new health diagnosis
- A change in medication or worsening health condition at home
- Frequent falls or a decline in mobility at home
- A change in the home environment
- An inability to stay at home without assistance

The home health care team

Our multidisciplinary home health care team works with you and your physician to develop a plan of care specifically tailored to your unique health care needs. Your clinical care team may include:

- Registered nurse or licensed practical nurse
- Physical therapist or physical therapy assistant
- Occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant
- Speech-language pathologist or speech-language pathology assistant
- Medical social worker
- Registered dietitian
- Certified home health aide

Home health care programs

With specialized education materials, home exercise programs, and telehealth monitoring, our specialty programs help patients improve their health, manage chronic conditions, remain safe at home, and stay out of the hospital. We offer several home health care programs for patients with certain conditions and diseases who need additional specialized care, including:

Chronic Care—assists patients with chronic disease management for congestive heart failure (CHF) and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD)

Stroke Care—helps stroke patients recover by improving their overall function through therapy

Maximum Mobility—designed to improve functional mobility and overall quality of life for those facing balance issues

Joint Express at Home—helps patients return home safely after hip and knee surgery

Philips Lifeline—ensures patients remain safe and independent in the comfort of their own home
