THE FUTURE OF CANCER TODAY

Cancer used to be the word that no one wanted to say, but today's interconnected, proactive approach brings discussions about cancer out into the open where they should be. Now, patients and their care team work together to personalize treatments, access clinical trials and research, and consult with others around the state, the nation, and even the world.

MULTIDISCIPLINARY APPROACH

In addition to a full team of medical professionals, patients have access to a complement of the latest treatments, services, therapies, and clinical trials. Two dedicated departments – medical oncology and radiation oncology – improve patient outcomes through a multidisciplinary approach to care. Stereotactic Radiosurgery (SRS) is just one example of advanced technology available. Its speed, precision, and convenience frees patients from excessive radiation exposure and long appointments – outperforming the GammaKnife and CyberKnife.

THE BEST CARE CLOSE TO HOME

An important goal for Karmanos Cancer Institute at McLaren Northern Michigan was to streamline the treatment process, so patients can stay close to home whenever possible. Coordinating treatment and maintaining medical information can be slow and expensive when patients must travel elsewhere. This is why, thanks to one dedicated cancer network, our oncologists, hematologists, and surgeons are immediately connected with their colleagues throughout the Karmanos network. This single information system allows for long-distance consultations, speeds patient diagnoses, and maximizes the quality of treatment.

TREATING THE WHOLE PERSON

Each person and family system is unique and requires an individualized approach to cancer treatment. Karmanos Cancer Institute at McLaren Northern Michigan is committed to patients' unique needs through a number of specialized programs. Nurse navigation guides patients through the sometimes arduous task of managing the condition. Dietary specialists assist with changing needs due to the effects of treatment. An oncological social work focuses on the psychosocial aspects of all phases of the cancer care continuum including prevention, diagnosis, treatment, long-term survivorship, terminal care, and bereavement.

YOUR JOURNEY

While you and your family adjust to a new diagnosis, staff members are committed to helping you understand and manage your care plan. We are pleased to offer individualized support. As a patient, you are the central and most important member of your care team.

NURSE NAVIGATORS

A nurse navigator guides cancer patients through screening, diagnosis, surgery, therapy and recovery. The goal is education and support, empowering patients to make informed treatment decisions throughout their journey. Navigators access advanced software increasing speed, efficacy and coordination of individual treatment plans and focus on breast, lung, head and neck cancers.

NURSING TEAM

Nursing colleagues in medical and radiation oncology work hand-in-hand with patients, families, caregivers, medical care team and the community to assure that an appropriate care plan is developed and implemented to meet individual patient needs. The nursing team works collaboratively to educate patients and schedule medical care. Many nurses specialize in cancer care and are designated Oncology Certified Nurses (OCN). Nurses work directly with physicians, medical assistants, and the entire care team.

ONCOLOGY SOCIAL WORKER AND INTEGRATIVE THERAPIES

Social workers address the psychosocial needs of the patient and their families, advocating during all phases of cancer treatment. They help provide a sense of control, empowerment, and understanding. Integrative therapies are used with cancer treatments to treat the whole patient, which includes mind and body.

Integrative therapies place an emphasis on decreasing stress, anxiety and improving one's general sense of well-being.

NUTRITION COUNSELING

Nutritional needs vary depending on the disease, treatment and metabolism. It is important to know that not everyone has difficulty with nutrition. If you have any questions about nutrition or how to eat during your cancer care, please discuss with your doctor or nurse. He or she may refer you to our registered dietitian who can help address your needs.

SPIRITUAL AND PASTORAL CARE

A sense of meaning, purpose and connection beyond oneself can help to improve quality of life and put problems in perspective. Each person's spiritual beliefs and experiences are nurtured in different ways. The McLaren Northern Michigan chaplain is available for counsel and guidance.

RADIATION THERAPISTS

Radiation therapists work with radiation oncologists to provide daily radiation treatment under the doctor's prescription and supervision. They maintain daily records and regularly check treatment equipment to ensure proper working order.

MEDICAL PHYSICISTS

Trained with advanced degrees and specific credentialing, medical physicists work directly with radiation oncologists during treatment planning and delivery, overseeing the work of the dosimetrist to ensure that complex treatments are properly tailored for each patient. Medical physicists develop and direct quality control programs for equipment and procedures, ensuring radiation is delivered precisely and safely.

MEDICAL DOSIMETRISTS

Medical dosimetrists work with radiation oncologists and medical physicists to carefully calculate radiation dosing to ensure the tumor receives the prescribed amount. Using dedicated software, dosimetrists develop and optimize treatment plans that can best destroy the tumor while sparing healthy tissue.
